



CALIFORNIA MID-STATE FAIR YOUTH LEGACY PROJECT

The California Mid-State Fair and the James W. Brabeck Youth Legacy Fund, a fund of the Community Foundation San Luis Obispo County, announce the inaugural Youth Legacy Project.

All contributions will be focused in three specific areas.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships will be awarded to deserving and qualified youth exhibiting at the California Mid-State Fair.

- A scholarship will be awarded to an eligible recipient in four single-year increments totaling up to as much as \$20,000.
- A blind application process will be conducted online with consistency to secondary education requirements.

High school-age youth eligible to apply are those planning and eligible to participate in the California Mid-State Fair Junior Livestock Show, Industrial Education, Agriculture /Floriculture /Ornamental Horticulture or Tractor Restoration Project.

The scholarship recipient will:

- Act as an ambassador for the California Mid-State Fair and the Youth Legacy Project.
- Follow all the Legacy Project guidelines required for project production, exhibition, management, care and husbandry.
- After selection, students must maintain full-time enrollment status with 2.5 GPA or higher and be under no disciplinary actions.

Any student on academic probation or below required GPA will be given requisite time to correct.

CAPITAL FUNDING

Contributions will also support youth-related program capital projects or activities at the California Mid-State Fair that adhere to the Mission Statement of the California Mid-State Fair and the Mission Statement of the California Mid-State Fair Heritage Foundation.

EXHIBITOR HARDSHIP CASES

Creates a fund in which exhibitors may apply for a pre-defined hardship as a result of participation as an exhibitor at the California Mid-State Fair.

The inaugural fundraising event will held on Saturday, July 27, 2019
at the California Mid-State Fair.
